Hospice of Michigan to host free screening of Being Mortal on April 18 at Gaylord Evangelical Free Church

GAYLORD, Mich. (March 31, 2017) – Join <u>Hospice of Michigan</u> for a free screening and discussion of the PBS FRONTLINE documentary, <u>Being Mortal</u>, from 6 to 9 p.m. on Tuesday, April 18 at Gaylord Evangelical Free Church, located at 1649 M-32 in Gaylord. The 54 minute film is based on the best-selling book by Atul Gawande, M.D.

The film explores the hopes of terminally ill patients and their families, investigates the practice of caring for the dying, and delves into the relationships between patients and their doctors.
